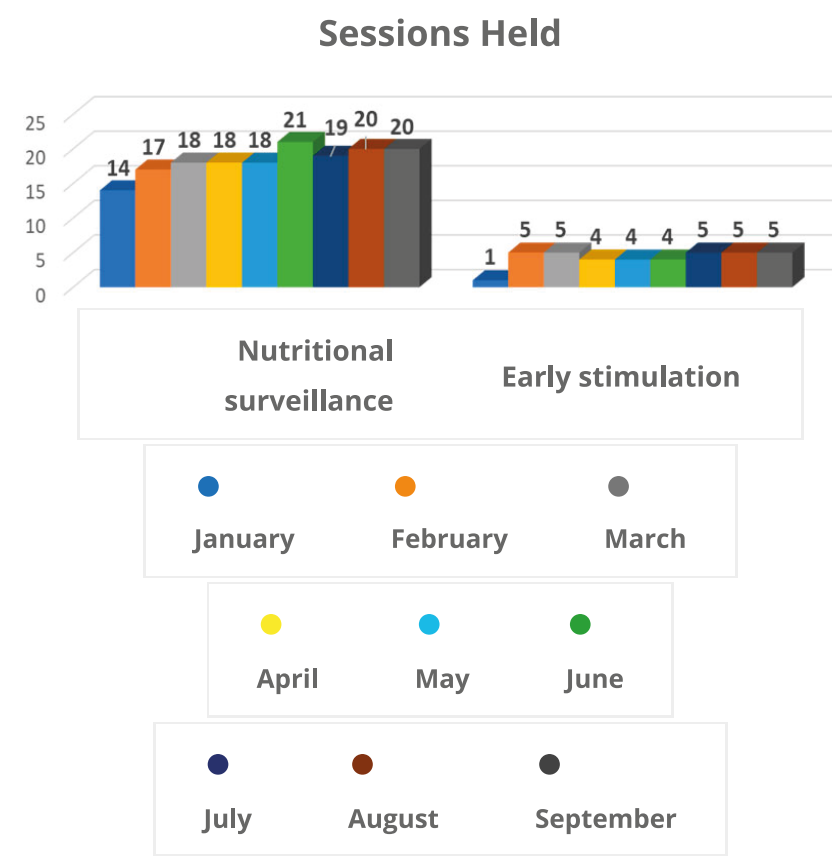
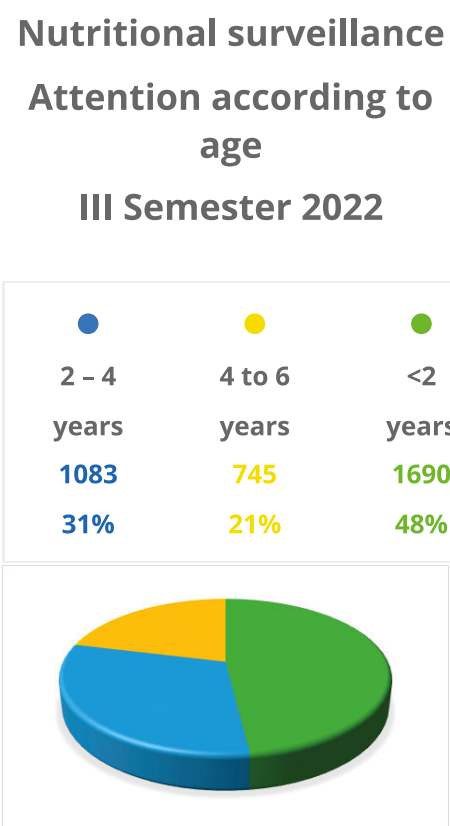
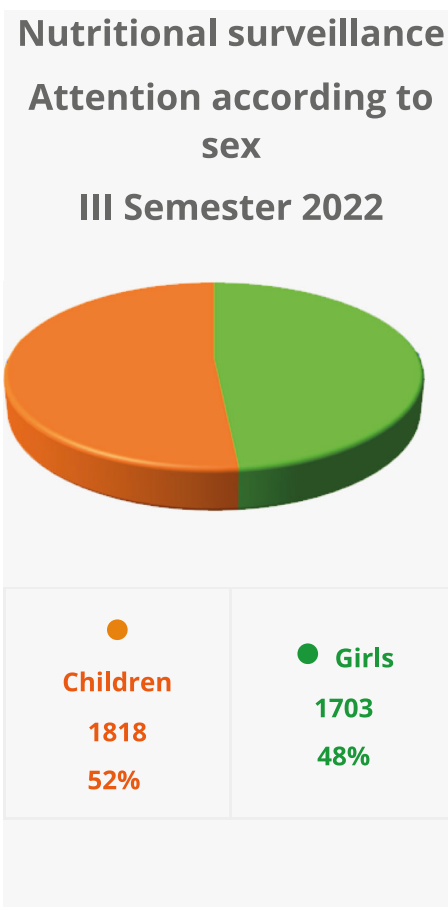


Comprehensive care for early childhood

With your support at the beginning of life, 165 nutritional monitoring sessions and 38 early stimulation sessions have been carried out, providing a total of 3,521 services to children aged 0 to 5 years in 18 communities during 2022.



90 community volunteers participated in comprehensive early childhood care activities. Training was provided to 134 volunteers and members of health committees.



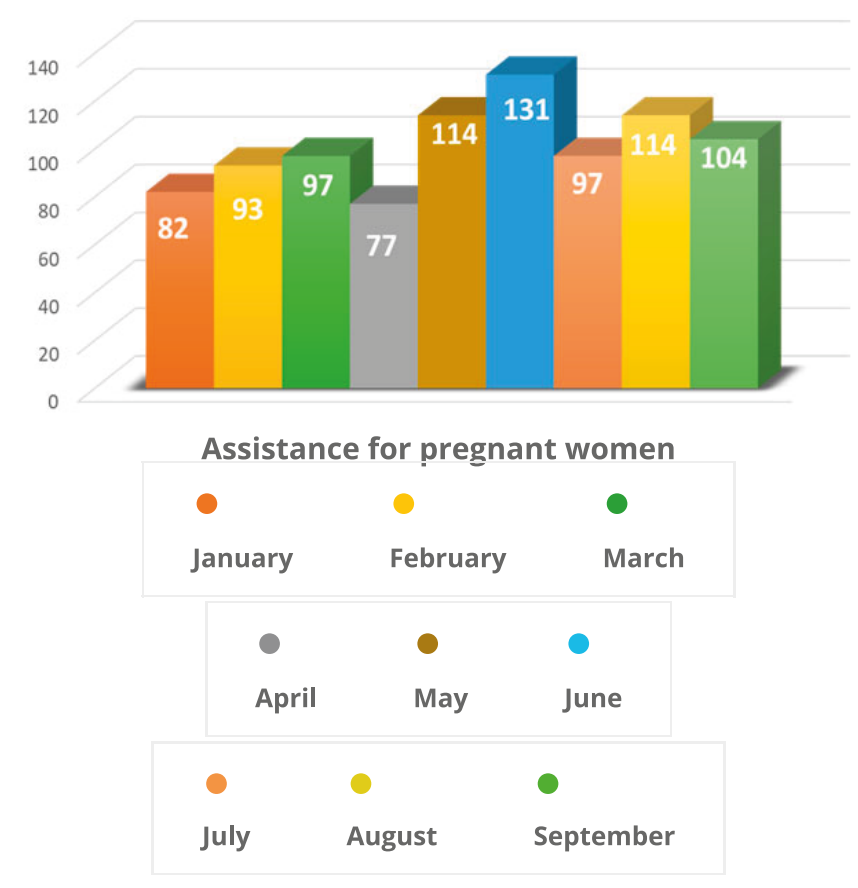
130,710 Nutributter sachets were distributed in 1,571 deliveries to children aged 6 months to 2 years; 2,595 kg of MannaPack Rice fortified food was delivered to children aged 6 months to 5 years.



Safe Motherhood

With your support for safe motherhood, 59 educational sessions have been held with pregnant women's clubs in 18 communities.

Pregnant women participate in safe maternity club



8.6% of pregnant women who attend are teenagers.

76,620 sachets of the Enov Mum supplement were distributed to 845 pregnant and lactating women.

80 postpartum women were identified and given a safe maternity basket containing baby clothing and hygiene products.



Healthy Housing

80 families raised awareness about the importance of using eco-stoves for family health and the environment.

17 families in vulnerable conditions benefit from an eco-stove, decreasing the risk of diseases caused by smoke and reducing firewood consumption to protect the environment.



15 families living in poverty now have new homes with the necessary conditions for healthy spaces.

14 families with children aged 0 to 5 years benefit from concrete floors, providing better hygienic conditions for child development.



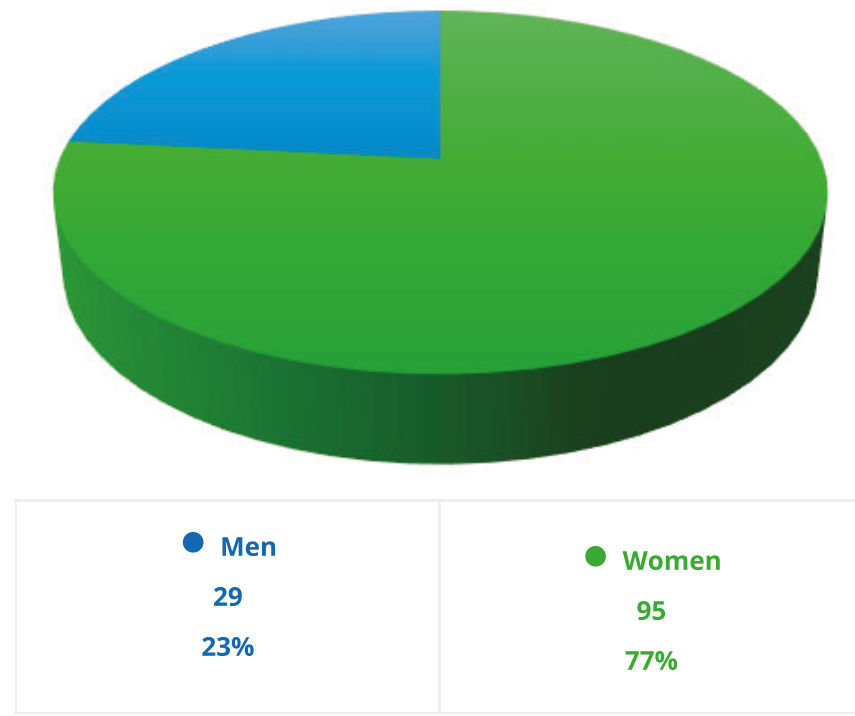
7 families reduce poverty-related deprivation and improve basic sanitation conditions with a washable latrine with septic tank.

124 people trained in patio planning

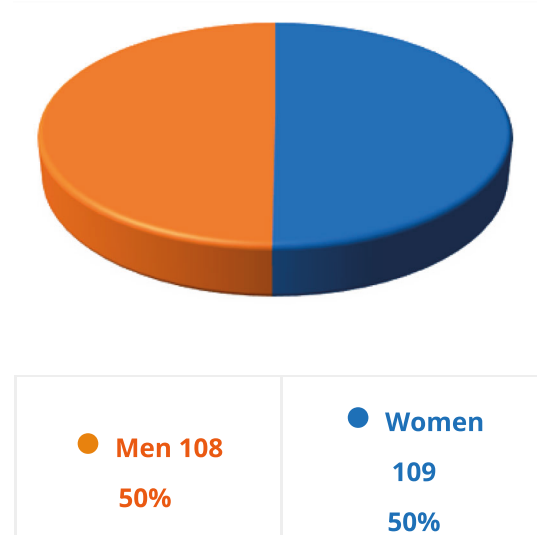


105 people trained on pests, diseases and integrated crop management.

217 third cycle students (7th, 8th and 9th grade) participate in 8 talks on sexual health and reproductive health for the prevention of pregnancy in adolescents.

148 second and third cycle students participate in the Scholarship-Tutoring program and benefit 444 first cycle students who receive support for academic reinforcement.
