

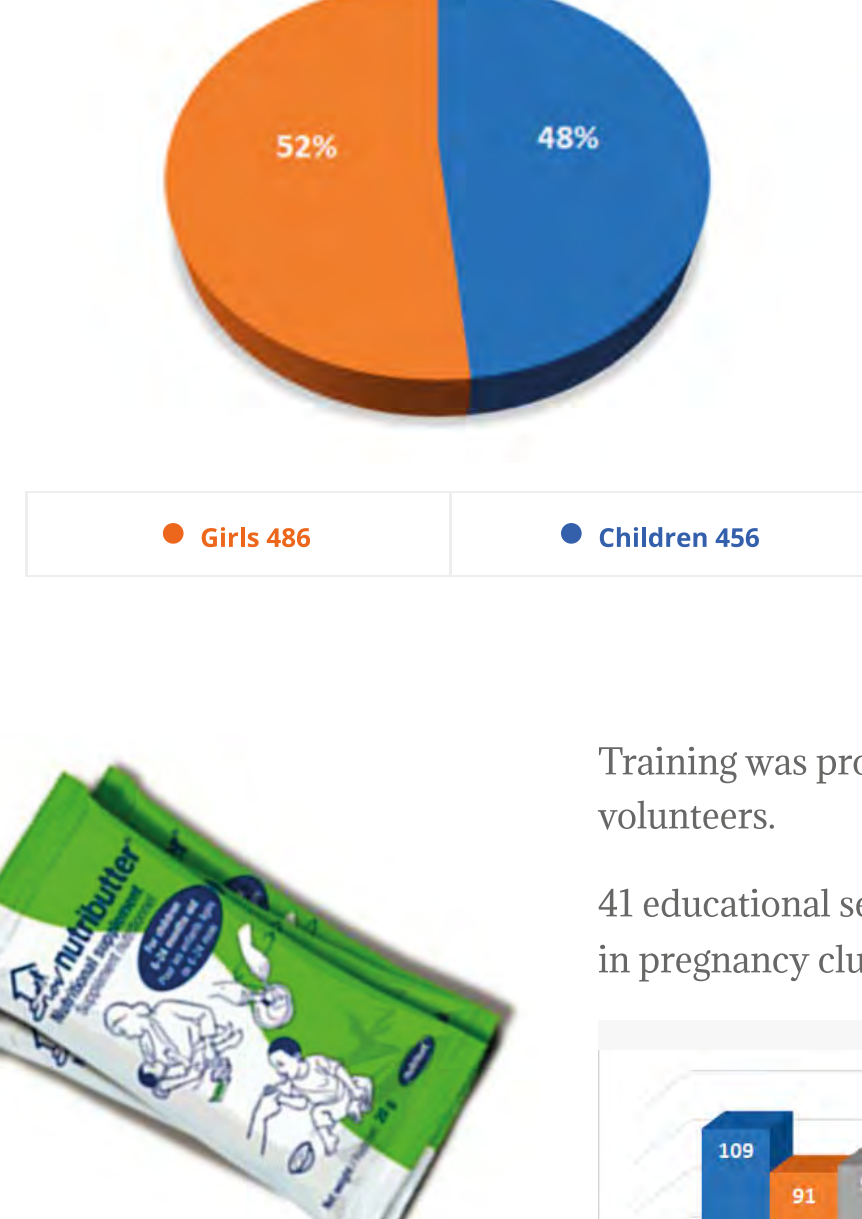
## Comprehensive care for early childhood

In the first semester, 118 nutritional surveillance sessions and 30 early stimulation sessions were carried out, providing a total of 2,718 services to children from 0 to 5 years of age from 18 communities.

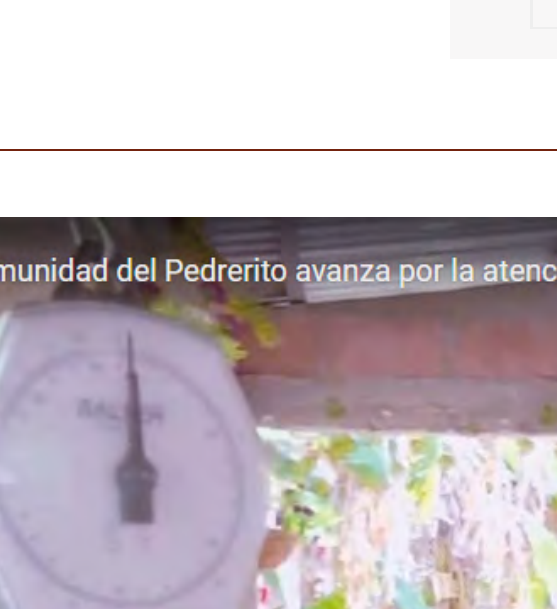
Nutritional Surveillance

I Semester 2023



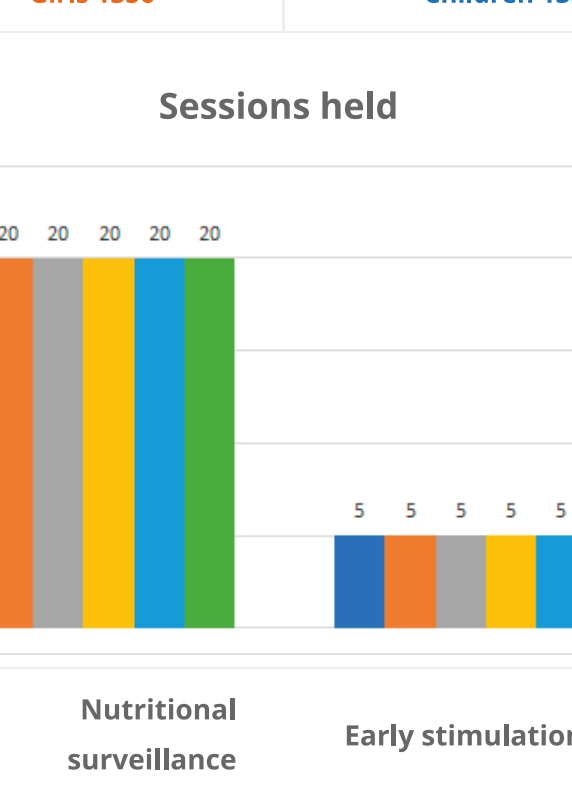
Improvements have been made to the infrastructure of 2 community spaces for early childhood care.



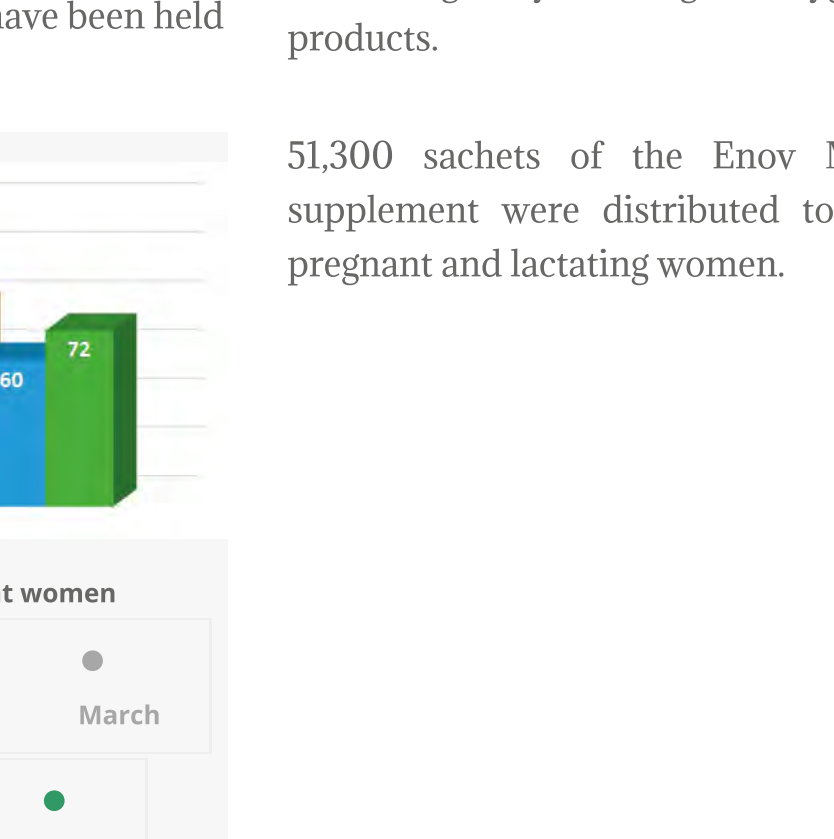
Early stimulation

Sessions held



138,900 Nutributter sachets were distributed in 695 deliveries to children aged 6 months to 2 years.

86 community volunteers participated in comprehensive early childhood care activities.

Training was provided to 83 volunteers.

41 educational sessions have been held in pregnancy clubs.



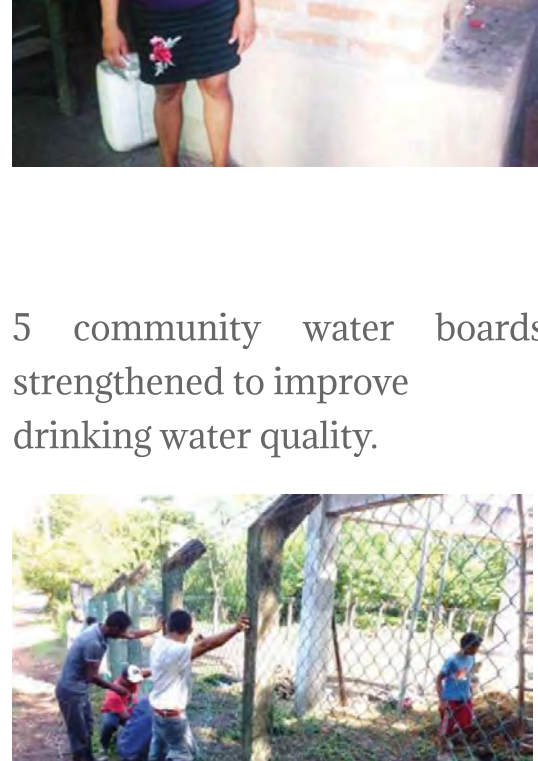
69 postpartum women were identified and given a safe maternity basket containing baby clothing and hygiene products.

51,300 sachets of the Enov Mum supplement were distributed to 475 pregnant and lactating women.

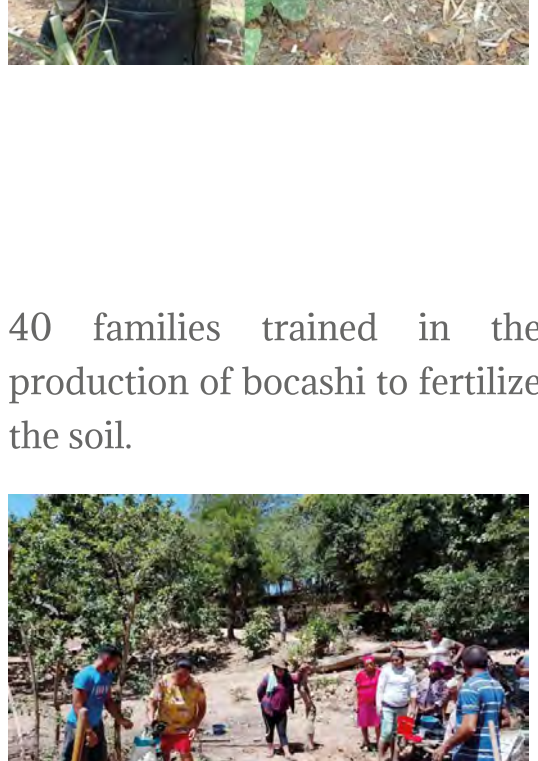


## Healthy Family

11 families with children aged 0 to 5 years benefit from concrete floors, providing better hygienic conditions for child development.



6 families improve basic sanitation conditions by building a washable latrine connected to a septic tank, reducing deprivation linked to multidimensional poverty.



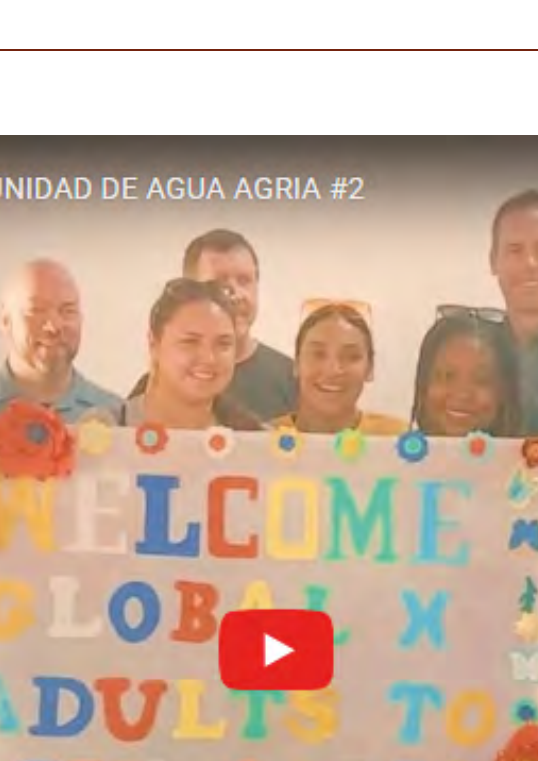
40 families that produce food in their own gardens are trained in biointensive farming.



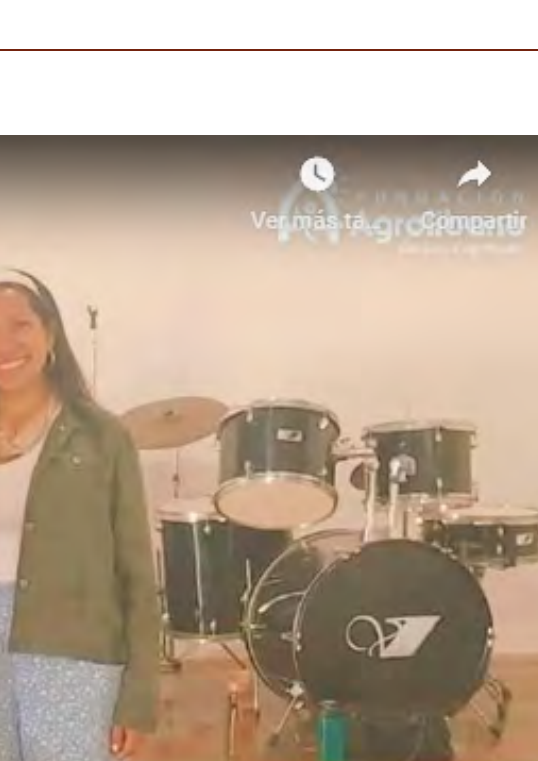
3 families improve the conditions of their homes by building eco-stoves with a fireplace, which reduce household smoke and contribute to environmental sustainability.



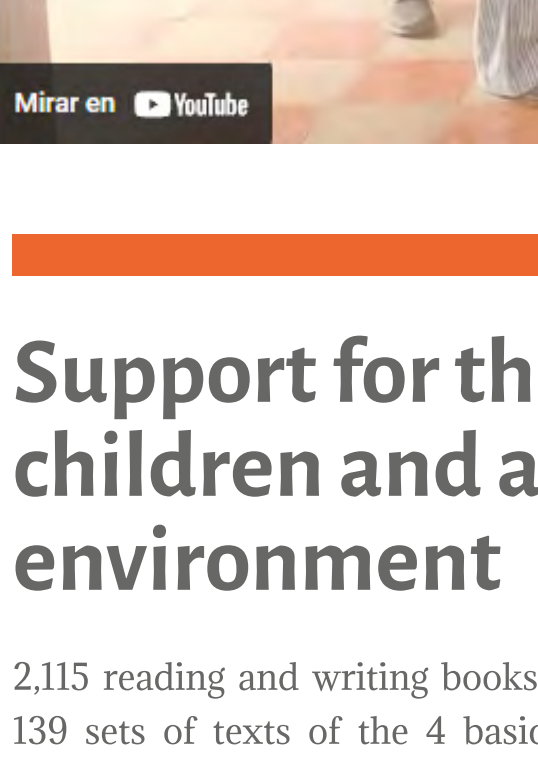
20 families receive talks to promote better hygiene habits and fill out a survey on knowledge, attitudes and practices in healthy housing.



18 communities carry out dengue prevention campaigns with educational activities, elimination of breeding sites, application of larvicide and fumigation, with corporate and community volunteers.



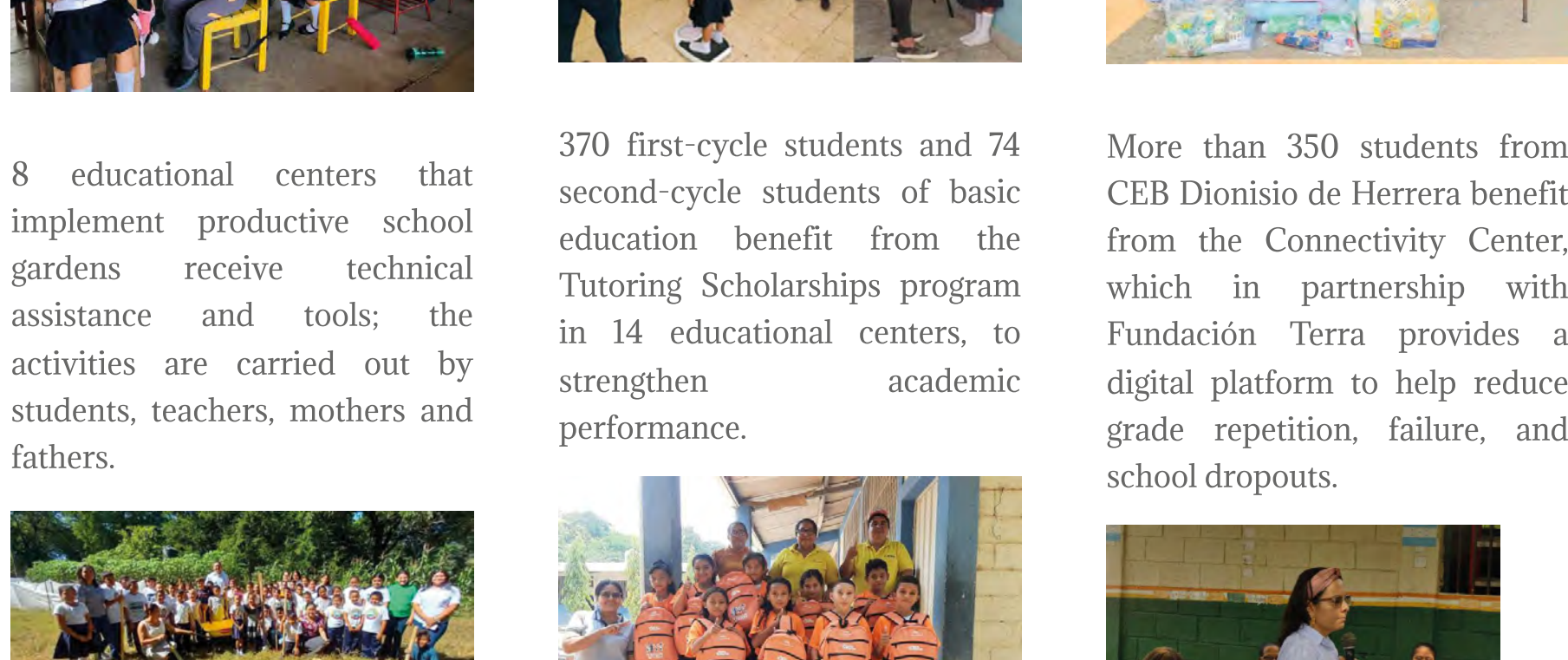
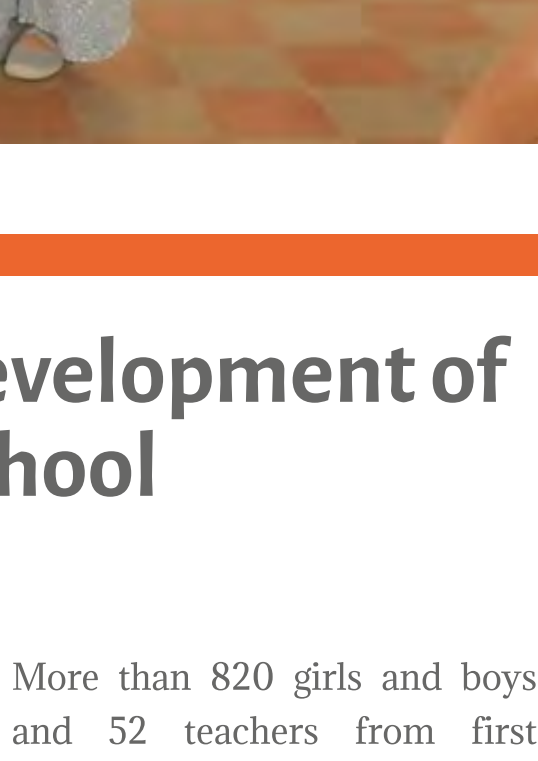
5 community water boards strengthened to improve drinking water quality.

## Support for the comprehensive development of children and adolescents in the school environment

2,115 reading and writing books, 139 sets of texts of the 4 basic subjects for teachers are distributed in 14 basic education centers.



More than 2,100 girls and boys in 28 public primary and pre-primary education centers are receiving health care during school days, with nutritional evaluation and deworming.



More than 820 girls and boys, and 52 teachers from first, second and third grade of primary school receive teaching materials.



8 educational centers that implement productive school gardens receive technical assistance and tools; the activities are carried out by students, teachers, mothers and fathers.



370 first-cycle students and 74 second-cycle students of basic education benefit from the Tutoring Scholarships program in 14 educational centers, to strengthen academic performance.



More than 350 students from CEB Dionisio de Herrera benefit from the Connectivity Center, which in partnership with Fundación Terra provides a digital platform to help reduce grade repetition, failure, and school dropouts.



## Access to education for socially excluded groups

7 alternative education centres implemented in 5 communities to pre-primary, basic and secondary education.

Adolescents and young people with access to the 3rd cycle of basic education, according to their gender

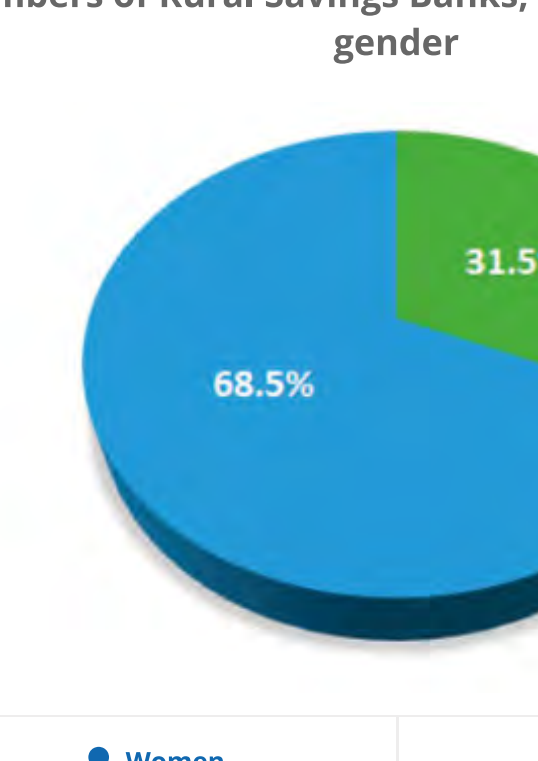


Jóvenes con acceso a educación media según género

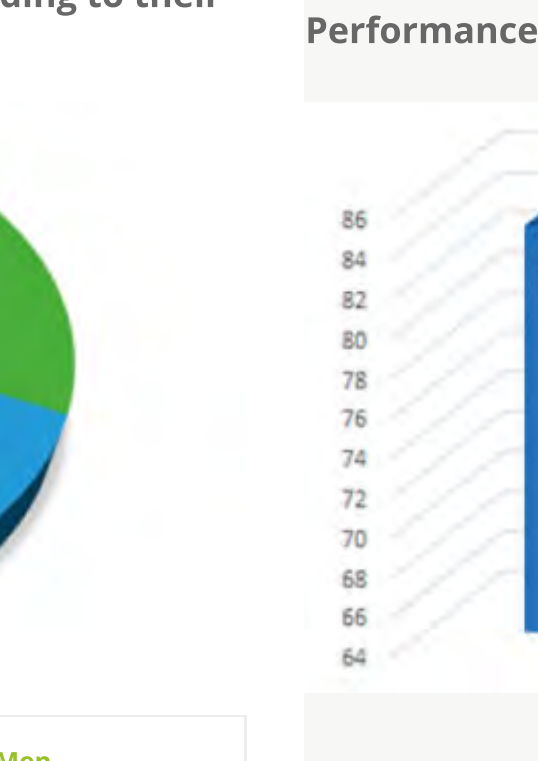


## Strengthening citizen participation for peace and development

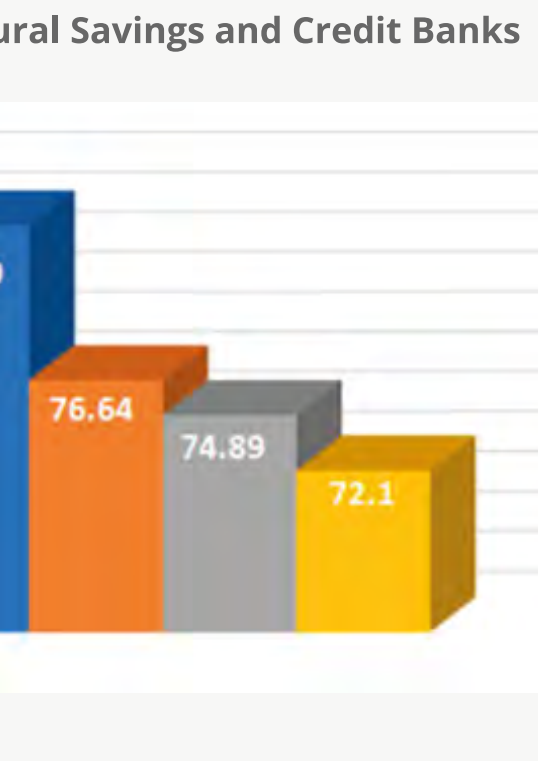
75 people from 8 health committees updated work plans for health promotion in 8 communities.



54 parents' associations and 6 teachers are trained on the APF Regulations and the preparation of PEC - Educational Projects for the Center and POA for 6 educational centers.



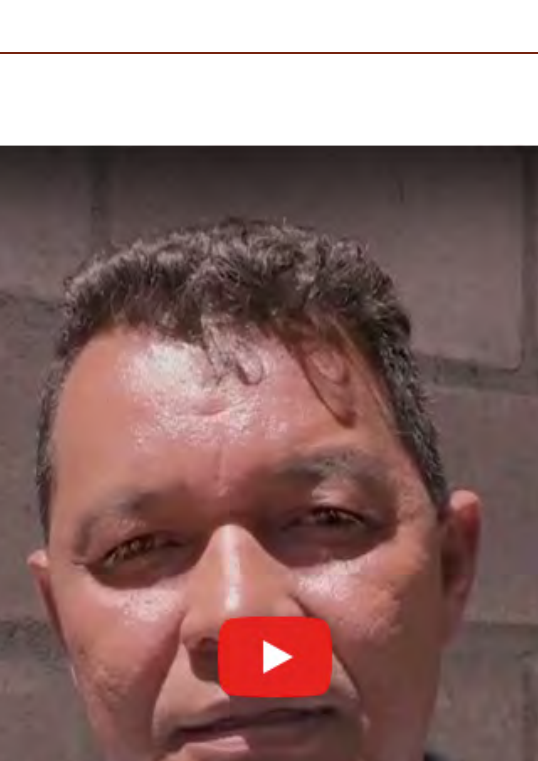
More than 3,600 plants were planted in a reforestation campaign carried out with the participation of 196 people in communities in Choluteca and Valle.



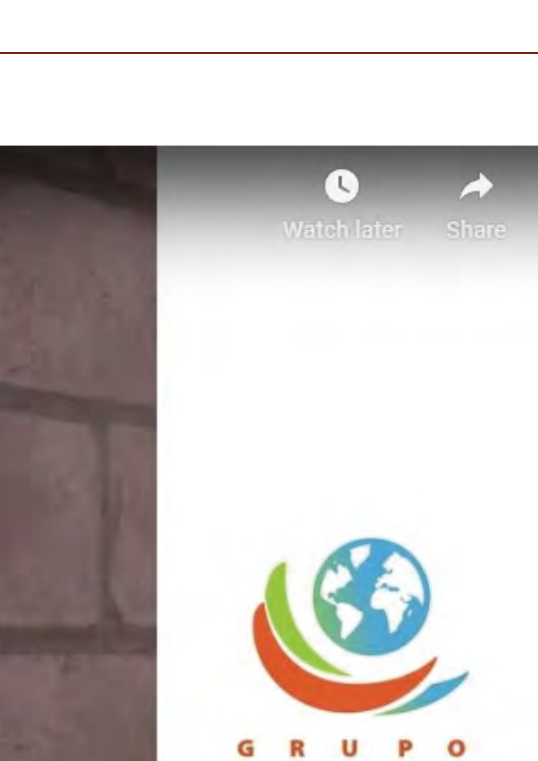
Three communities are making progress in updating their comprehensive development plans.



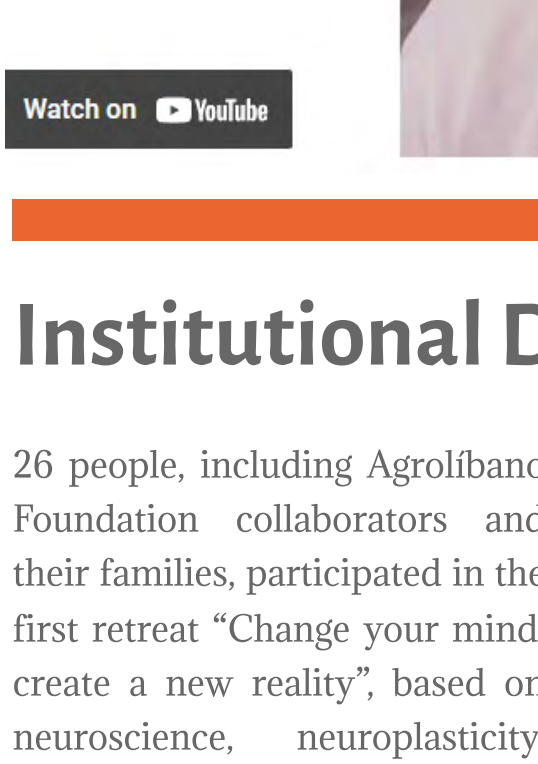
63 community leaders, 46 women and 17 men, are strengthened with 18 hours of training to design community projects to manage.



5,000 plants produced in 4 community nurseries in coordination with micro-basin councils and community water boards.



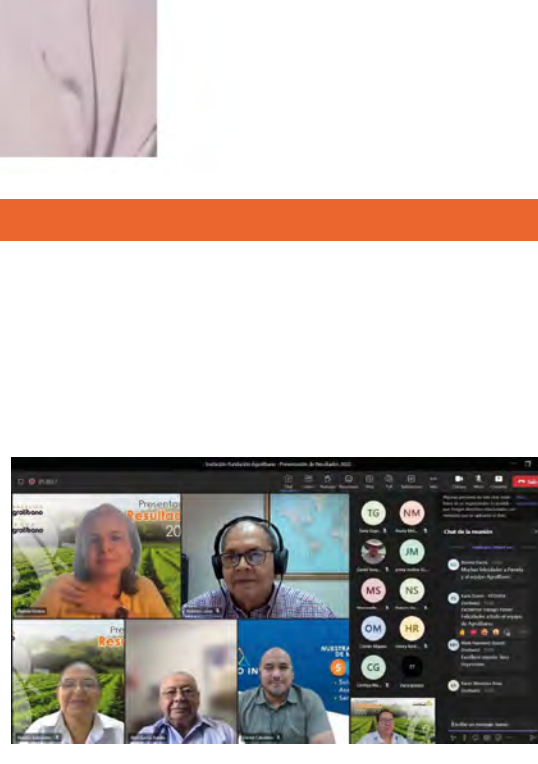
The Calaire Microbasin Council was supported in the construction of a 16-meter stone curtain to prevent erosion in the water source recharge area.



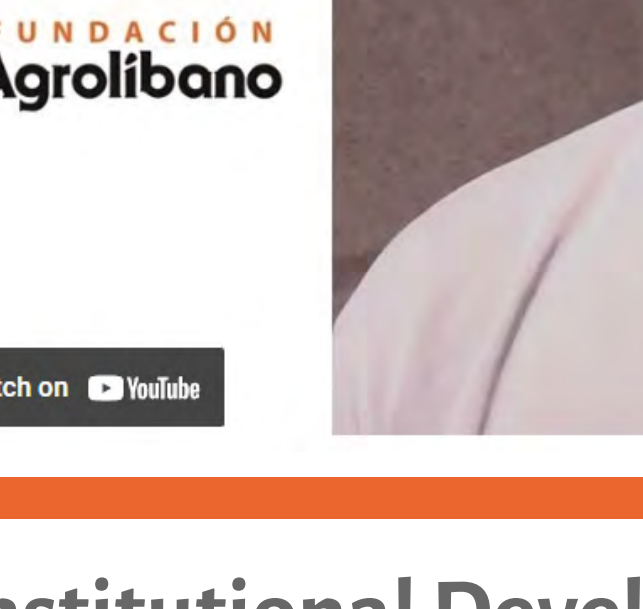
Members of 2 Microbasin Councils: Namasigüe and Calaire, received 36 hours of training on the application of internal regulations and care of the environment.



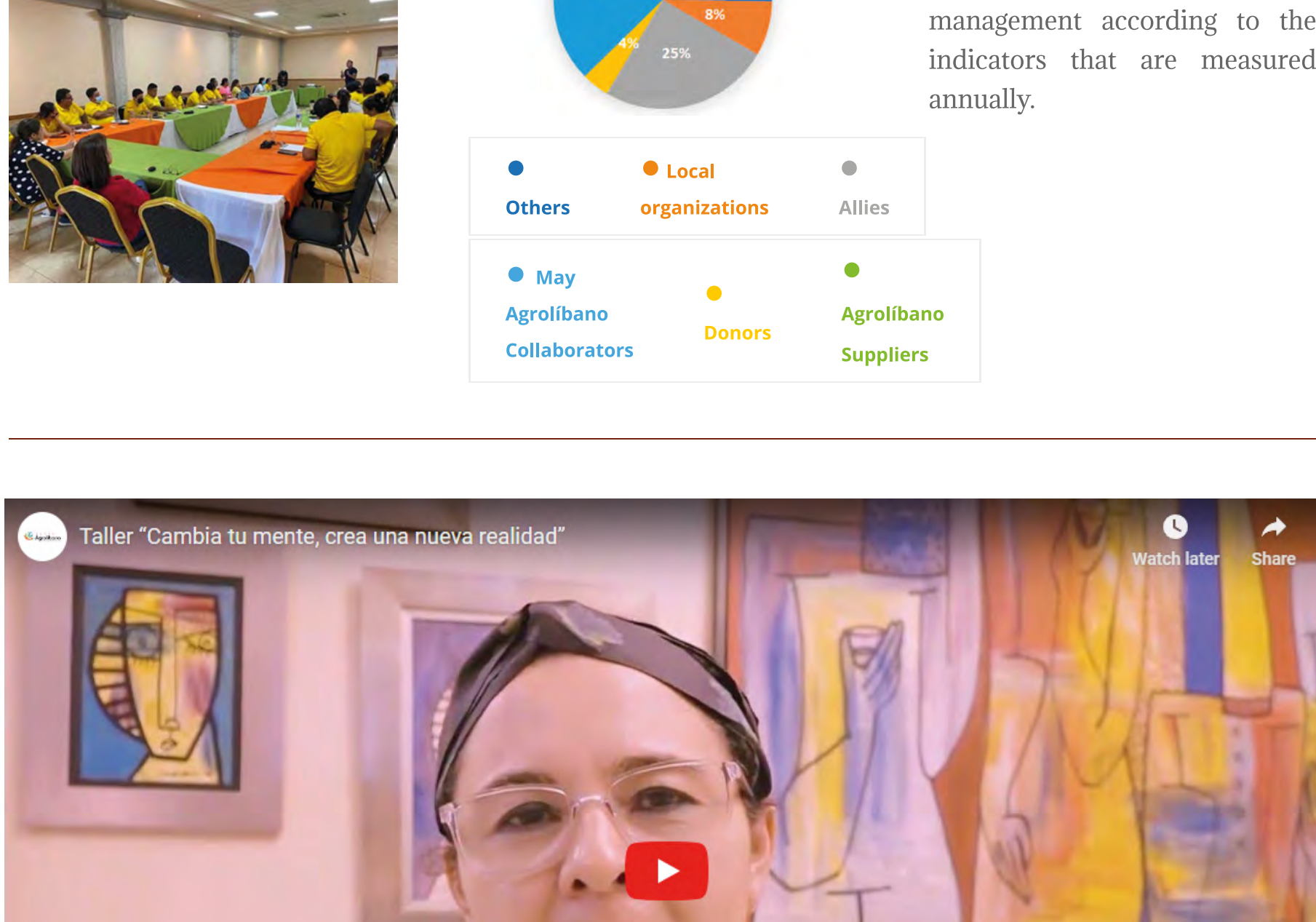
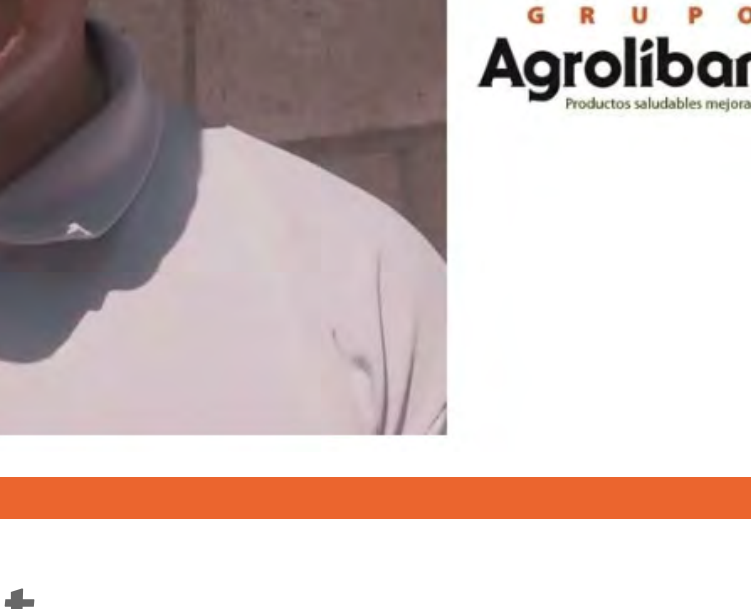
